By bringing in experts from the NDRF and the Gujarat State Disaster Management Authority, the school aimed to provide comprehensive training that goes beyond theoretical understanding, enabling students to respond effectively in the face of potential hazards. The initiative emphasized the importance of a proactive and responsible attitude towards safety, not only for individual well-being but also for the collective safety of co-workers and co-travellers.























CPR TRAINING

A few years ago, the world was profoundly shaken by the global impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Amidst the ongoing challenges, instances of sudden health emergencies, such as chest pains, palpitations, or even cardiac arrests, can occur unpredictably in various settings – be it on the road, at the workplace, or at home. Recognizing the importance of preparedness in such critical situations, the school took a proactive step to equip all teachers, the school nurse, security personnel, and supporting staff with essential life-saving skills.





On 13th of January, a specialized team, comprising a doctor and two assistants from Zydus Hospital Vadodara, visited the school to conduct a comprehensive training session on Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). The workshop went beyond theoretical explanations, ensuring that each member of the DPSH staff actively participated by practising CPR techniques on a training dummy. This hands-on approach allowed them to grasp the nuances of applying the right pressure and adopting the correct posture during CPR.

This vital workshop was not just an educational exercise but a crucial step in ensuring that every member of the DPSH staff is well-prepared for unforeseen health emergencies. By imparting practical knowledge and skills, the school has taken a commendable initiative to make its staff future-ready and capable of responding effectively in critical situations.



Paying Homage - Harni Lake


