
NATIONAL ACADEMY OF INDIAN RAILWAYS


Field Trip - Class X

The Indian Railways is one of the most complicated networks with upscale technology as support. To get a first-hand knowledge of this complex system, the students of Class X were taken to the National Academy of Indian Railways, Pratapnagar, Vadodara on 13th and 27 th August, 2022, Saturday.

Through live models, students learnt about traffic signals, traffic control system, track change, narrow- and broad-gauge lines, different symbols used, etc. They were also apprised of the role of Station Master in decision making, the history of railways, the different locomotives used in Indian Railways from 1952 to present day. During the interaction session, students asked different questions they had on the functioning of the Indian Railways, like, how accidents can be avoided, details about train timings.

The students not only enjoyed the visit but had a great learning experience.






















COMMUNITY SCIENCE CENTER

Field Trip - Class VI, VII and VIII

Field Trips were organized for classes VI, VII and VIII to Regional Community Science Center recognized by GUJCOST. The scientific activities focus on generating interest, enthusiasm and creating scientific and technological curiosity among children.

The center has a vast array of working models.

LIFE SCIENCE HALL—It included structure of various cells, micro-organisms, structure of different plants, models on respiratory, digestive and circulatory system, reproduction and evolution of various animals.

GENERAL SCIENCE HALL- It has many models including sand and stick pendulum, types of concave mirrors, unending well illusion based on multiple reflection, Newton's Cradle, RGB lights, a solar system models, a huge periscope, kaleidoscope etc.

ENERGY HALL- It has different types of solar cooker, power plant model, a cycle model to show how mechanical energy is converted into electrical energy etc.

TECHNOLOGY HALL- It has the models on different types of gliders and jets, rocket models and daily use gadgets, digital microscope through which students observed micro-organisms.





Flying Through The Colors



ALUMNI CORNER

What do we know about stories?

Het me take you back to your childhood. You are five years old and have just come back home from preschool on a lazy Thursday afternoon. Your grandmother adores her mid-day siesta and the only way she can get that is by putting you to sleep as well. So, basking in the soft light of the dipping sun that enters through the curtains, she indulges you in an activity. She tells you stories of magical kingdoms and brave warriors, of evil stepmothers and fairy godmothers, of cosmic battles and adventures of barons in the seas. She tells you tales of the past, the present and the future. And everytime you want to change the ending, she lets your imagination run wild.

I have spent many such afternoons with my grandmother, building characters, constructing stories, piping in alternate endings and reading even more. Be it textual, auditory or visual, stories have become a means of not just exchanging information, but also striking up conversations. Every time you hail a cab from the airport, your driver entertains you with stories that he has heard about the city. Or perhaps, a Kishore Kumar and Lata Mangeshkar hit song blasting through the radio is enough for him to narrate his recollections of the past.

Isn't that what connects us? I'd suppose so. We are captivated by stories because, as self-centered as it may sound, we try to see our reflection in them. It is what human beings do—crave stories to make sense of the world. Naturally, we are drawn to everything that transports us to realities far from the current one. It is interesting to note that we may pass on to other dimensions, but stories outlive us all. It is said that man tries to find a purpose that would enable him to leave a mark forever. Maybe that is why the legends remain well-preserved.
